### **Park News by Jim Gast, Park Superintendent: Volunteering to Meet the Mission**

By now you have probably read or heard about the layoffs in the Division of State Parks. We lost our Park Maintenance Worker I position, and our Interpretive Resource Technician position was cut to three-quarter time. This position is responsible for clerical duties as well as interpretive programs. Our seasonal labor budget was cut by 50% before the fiscal year began in July.

We still have the task of making sure that visitors have a great park experience, and we need to keep up with our stewardship efforts. How can we make these happen? The simple answer is volunteers. Through October, volunteers have contributed almost 2400 hours to the park this year. (This does not include any of the hours contributed by FoRB members). In order to continue to do what we've done in the past, we will need to increase those hours from volunteers. Currently, volunteers assist with invasive species control, fire line construction, prescribed burns, interpretive programs, Wild Cave Tours, trail construction and maintenance, litter clean up, updating bulletin boards, mowing, pink planarian and stream critter counts, stream health surveys, butterfly surveys, frog and toad surveys, bird counts, garden bed weeding, and assisting in the office.

## Park Natural History/History by Kathryn DiFoxfire, Interpretive Resource Tech: Ski Rock Bridge

Winter is almost here, and forecasts are calling for snow. Rock Bridge Memorial State Park offers more than 11 miles of designated trails suitable for cross-country skiing if there is sufficient snow cover. The trails vary in degree of difficulty and scenery. Some portions of the 8.5 mile Gans Creek Wild Area trails are also suitable for cross-country skiing.

Cross country skiing and snowshoeing are two of the best ways to experience the silence and solitude of the park in winter while watching for wildlife and animal sign in the snow. Trails are marked with colored arrows on posts and/or colored plastic blazes on trees. White trails are shortcuts on a loop trail. Recommended trails for beginners include the **Grassland Trail (2 miles, blue)** and **Karst Trail (1.9 miles, red)**. Both trails offer gentle terrain through fields and woods and pass by many excellent sinkholes. Some mowed firelines that intersect these trails may be used as trails but will not be marked.

Intermediate to advanced skiers may wish to venture onto the **High Ridge Trail (2 miles, blue)**. Trail is primarily along a grassy ridge which offers a good view of the surrounding countryside. Two long hills offer exciting downhill runs for the experienced. Part of the western wooded section parallels Clear Creek.
